It has been a season of rest and restoration at Bluestem these many months, now moving into a season of life-giving. In the grasslands we are accompanied by swiftly moving foragers and the call of the Eastern Meadowlark. In the woods, the wind blowing wildly through bare trees announces the arrival of early spring. People have come to be nourished over these winter months as well, walking the paths in memory of a loved one or arriving to say farewell with a green burial. We prepare the site and dig the grave. They craft the burial service entirely on their own with friends, ministers, poets, guitar players, songwriters, dogs, children, the birds in the trees, the wind across the fields. Always with nature. This past week, the earth surrounding the grave held remnants of our controlled burn that took place a week ago. Bright poppies, anemones and ranunculus filled the grave before a loved one was lowered into it. After a song, the family and friends began the hard work of saying farewell with each handful and shovelful of red dirt, their bodies releasing into love and laughter, fully returning him home.

Welcome to Bluestem.

RESTORATION IN THE FIELDS

Have you noticed a different look in our fields? Last month, we began using prescribed fire as one of our management strategies for restoring the grasslands. Working with our friends at <u>Wildland Forestry and</u> <u>Environmental, Inc</u>., we selected portions of the fields to burn and left enough open grasslands untouched for the wildlife. The controlled burn will help return nutrients to the soils, reduce competition from invasives and enhance the biodiversity of our native plant species. Our partners at <u>Triangle</u> <u>Land Conservancy</u> provide a great description of one of <u>their controlled</u> <u>burns here</u>. We can't wait to see the impact in the next few weeks as pockets of green push up in all the fields. More about <u>Bluestem's conservation</u> <u>strategies here</u>.

ARRANGING FOR BURIAL

Interested in green burial at Bluestem? If so, be sure to complete a **Burial Preference Form** online to be added to our reservation list. We are currently preplanning with individuals who submitted forms late last year. We will open another round of sales in late April. A few important steps that you can take ahead of time are:

For **immediate need burial** (or close to immediate need) please contact <u>Jeff</u> or <u>Heidi</u> to make arrangements. At this time, a minimum 3 days' notice is needed before scheduling a burial. Note that weather conditions may also factor into our timing.
