During the months of March and April we continued to fundraise, plan and present on activities at Bluestem. In March, we used it for bush hogging the fields in time for the spring planting of Bluestem's native grasses and wildflowers. Working together with Garrett Wildflower Seed Farm, 26 acres of former agricultural land are being converted into biodiverse habitat. What excitement we feel watching the seedlings for Little Bluestem, Split Beard Grass, Coreopsis, Black-eyed Susans, Purple Coneflower, and Cosmos emerge. And of course, we have more equipment and materials to purchase in order to tackle the woodland restoration, build trails, and ultimately provide for burial services at Bluestem. BURIAL AT BLUESTEM

Burial is not yet available at Bluestem while we await final permitting from Orange County. Once Bluestem receives its approvals the nature preserve will be open to the public 365 days a year from dawn to dusk. The natural sanctuary will be open for community services, the trails for walking and hiking, and other areas of the property for quiet reflection.

Future burial plots will be available in two distinct areas of the restored landscape: the native grasslands and woodlands. Gravemarkers are allowed at Bluestem, but must lie flat to the ground. Burial fees will be announced via this newsletter and on the website in late spring. All burial arrangements and record-keeping will be managed by Bluestem Community.
