YAY WOODLAND TRAILS!

Three cheers to our [hearty volunteer trail crew](#), individual donors, the [Strowd Roses Foundation](#), and to the [Conservation Corps of North Carolina](#)! Their collective contributions produced another mile of trail through this beautiful property, expanding our hiking network to approximately 3.5 miles. CCNC crew members trained up on their skills, blazing the new route, limbing trees, clearing rocks and attending to drainage, while our volunteers followed behind reinforcing the tread, building bridges and replanting native species. *On top of all that hard work, another super skilled volunteer has [revised our map](#) so that trails are easy to find.*

Come out and travel the Inner Circuit Trail following the yellow arrows. Find the trail heads off Bluestem Road – across from the first field grasslands, and near the turnaround by the Black Walnut trees. Let us know if you see the heron that's been spotted near the creeks' confluence!

IN THE FIELDS

Have you wondered about the mowed pathways weaving through the grasslands? Some of these paths are permanent while others are temporary lanes. Bluestem's cemetery design includes these temporary lanes, cut only as needed to access burial sites in the interior of the fields. We also use the lanes to avoid crossing over a grave with equipment.

At the end of a burial ceremony, families mound pine straw over the grave and scatter wildflower seeds provided by staff, around the site. An [engraved grave marker](#) is placed in the center of every grave, with GPS coordinates given to families so they can find

graves hidden by nature. Over time, the gravesite, as well as the mowed lanes, regenerate according to the season -- colorful wildflowers in the warmer months, and grazing birds in the winter.
