Robbie Guy Ingle died peacefully on May 6, 2024 at the age of 60. He was born in Alamance County to Sarah and John Ingle and graduated from Eastern Alamance High School. After graduating from UNC-Greensboro in 1988, he traveled throughout Europe before beginning his career as a comptroller for Crown Automotive, which became part of Asbury Automotive. He retired early at age 50.

Rob loved animals as much as anyone, especially his cocker spaniels. He raised a deer he named Zoe and was so proud of his grand-deer, Chloe and Chucky. There were also many fish, goats, chickens, and a few donkeys on the Hurdle Mills “farmette” that he shared with his husband, Scott.

Those were difficult, taxing years but he faithfully provided around-the-clock care for as long as he could safely do so. She died just shy of her 99th birthday.
